Vision

Action Steps

What does your committee plan to do to achieve these goals?

Our first step is to identify parents that are willing to be a part of this Committee countywide, who can commit to taking this information back to their various schools, partnering with parents who are willing to translate literature for the PTA that could be sent home to notify families of activities that are planned for their benefit.

Work with the various PTA presidents to see what the needs are and, to learn of the successful practices at their school.

Form a partnership with the MCPS Division of Family and Community Partnership and Linkages to Learning to reach out to these families especially low-income families and multi cultural families in our community.

To find ways to overcome the various barriers that hinder parents from being involved in their children lives.

Identify ways PTA leaders in the county could assess where families and educators are in adopting the Parent Involvement best practices recommended in the report of the State Board of Education's newly adopted Maryland Parent Advisory Council report, Shared Responsibility: Recommendations for Increasing Family and Community Involvement in Schools.

One of the missions of the PTA is: To encourage parent and public involvement in the public schools. The activities of this committee, Parent Leadership, will directly support that mission as well as MCCPTA's focus on supporting student achievement. Research shows that schools that show the greatest improvement in student achievement have high levels of parent, family and community involvement.

Action Steps

Finding "diversity liaisons" from these cultures to reach those parents, and who are willing to translate literature for the PTA that could be sent home to notify various families of activities that are planned for their benefit.

Form a partnership with the MCPS Division of Family and Community Partnership and Linkages to Learning to reach out to these families especially the low-income families and multi cultural families in our community to find ways to overcome the various barriers that hinder parents from being involved in their children lives.

We will be working with the Parent Advisory Council of MCPS to present the International Parent Education Workshop, which would target Immigrant Parents but include all other parents. The purpose of this workshop is to create a forum for these parents, to introduce them to the school system, and empowering them with the resources and information that they need to be involved and effective advocates for their children, whilst at the same time developing leadership skills within those who may not be aware of the many skills that are hidden within them.
