- MCCPTA_Presidents – Direct communication from the MCCPTA President to the local presidents. *All Presidents should join.*
- MCCPTA_Presidents_Discussion – Advice, suggestions, recommendations, issue-oriented discussion among local PTA presidents.

- MCCPTA_Treasurers – Treasurer-related issues and advice. *All treasurers should join.*

For High School Presidents:

- HS_PTSA_Presidents – Discussion among High School Presidents only.

Being a Delegate

Welcome to new and returning delegates! Our first Delegates' Assembly is Tuesday, September 28, 7:30, in the Carver Auditorium. There will be a special program on the Common Core Standards beforehand at 6:30.

A few things to know about Delegates Assemblies:

- Delegates' Assemblies are held the 4th Tuesday of every month at 7:30pm.
- Many Delegates' Assemblies will be preceded by a special program of interest.
- Each local PTA is entitled to 3 voting members of the Delegates Assembly (the President and 2 delegates).
- Can't make every meeting? The PTA can name alternate delegates.
- Check your local PTA bylaws on whether your delegates are elected or appointed.
- Once your PTA begins submitting dues payments, you will receive 3 voting cards.
- Delegates represent the position of their local PTA membership at the Delegates Assemblies.
- There is one vote per delegate, even if you represent more than one school.
- Delegates can make or amend motions without prior direction from their local PTA membership.
- Stay up-to-date on all issues by subscribing to the Delegate e-list and come to the Delegates Assemblies informed and ready to vote on behalf of your school.

A special note on delegate's voting cards:

If you are a new delegate, do try to obtain the delegate voting card from your predecessor. These cards are valid until November 1. We understand though that some previous delegates "disappear" and voting cards cannot be had. When that is the case, we will work on an honor system until November 1. Do make sure to ask your President for a new card. As soon as your PTA submits dues to MCCPTA, delegate voting cards are sent to your PTA and you will be set for the year!

Board members view these meetings as an opportunity to get better acquainted with the community and to discuss positions on issues pending before the Board. Given that the Board is made aware of major initiatives in the cluster, as well as pressing budget needs in advance of the cluster meeting, please advise cluster leadership that there is no need to have presentations that repeat this information. Board members are eager to use the cluster visits as an opportunity for two-way dialogue with the cluster leadership and community members on issues of concern to that particular cluster. So, the BOE encourages clusters to use a meeting format that fosters opportunities for two-way interaction and avoids simply asking questions of the members of the Board.

Public Comment Sought by Board of Education

· Policy FKB, *Modernization/Renovation*. This policy sets forth guidelines to establish a systematic approach for replacement of building systems and facilities. The focus of the policy should shift to sustaining schools in good condition through systematic life-cycle asset replacement, as well as modernization. The proposed revisions acknowledge that improved initial construction methods now enable MCPS to extend the useful life of school buildings and the length of time before full modernization/replacement of schools is required.

· Earlier this year, the Board tentatively adopted Policy IED, Framework and Structure of High School Education. This policy sets forth guidelines to staff and community for the organization of high schools and the delivery of instructional programs that set high expectations for academic achievement for all students and prepares them for success in postsecondary education and the world of work.

CIP-related issues already are in full swing. Following last year's participation in the FACT Review Committee, MCCPTA is participating in the development of the scoring methodology and weighting for the upcoming FACT assessments. Also, MCCPTA will have representatives in attendance during Dr. Weast's planning sessions leading to his Recommended CIP. MCCPTA's participation in these meetings provides a valuable opportunity for us to understand the issues presented and offer input in the process. Meetings begin September 7.

FACT Assessments: Clusters may comment on the proposed FACT assessment methodology (with scoring criteria) with the November 10 & 11 CIP comments. The BOE is targeting action on the FACT Assessments at its December 2010 meeting.

Modernization Policy (Policy FKB): The CIP Committee will provide information and a recommendation on the policy before comments are due.
